Dear Parents & Carers,

Today we have held our 'Crazy Hair Day' in aid of Comic Relief. We have really enjoyed the children's creative efforts and helped to raise money for a great charity in the process. In assembly today the children found out about the history of Red Nose Day, some of the celebrity findraisers that have taken place this year and heard stories from those that have benefitted from the money raised.

As you will be aware school was closed to some classes as a result of industrial action. This marks the end of the current planned action. I fully

The fair will be based in the school dining hall between 3.15pm and 3.45pm Monday - Thursday.





This week is British Science Week and year 3 and 4 have had a fantastic time carrying out practical experiments. We thought about "Noisy Neighbours" and how sound travels and how we hear sounds in different ways.



Our first experiment involved tying string to the two ends of a coat hanger and wrapping the string round our forefingers and swinging the coat hanger against the table or chair and seeing what sound we could hear.

We then repeated it by putting our fingers in our ears and were all amazed at what a difference it made. LKS2 challenge you to try this at home.

Our second experiment was making a string telephone and once the string was taut either listening or talking into the cup and seeing how clear the voices were!
