Dear Parents & Carers,

I would like to begin by wishing all of our families Happy Diwali who have been celebrating over the last week. In school we have marked the celebration by undertaking Diwali themed activities as part of Good 2 be Gold and our Y3/4pupils led our Diwali assembly on Thursday this week. Thank you to all of those family members who were able to join us.

During the first week after the half term break we held our Autumn Ball. Thank you to everyone that was able to support the event. On the evening we raised £1200!

During the week of Parents' Evening we held our Scholastic Book Fair. Thank you to everyone that purchased a book we have been able to purchase 60 new dictionaries for school with the commission that the fair generated.

As we approach winter and the usual seasonal coughs and colds I would like to remind everyone of the importance of regular attendance at school. During half term 1 14% of our pupils were persistently absent (missing more than 10% of school), and a significant number of these pupils were girls — this is above the national average, and as you will be aware this is a priority Education focus for our government. We also have more than 100 pupils who achieved 100% attendance during the first half term - these pupils have received a special certificate.

This year we will be supporting Right at Home with their Festive Friend campaign aiming to make a difference to the lives of isolated individuals in our community. We will be asking pupils to design a Christmas Card that the charity will pass on to members of the community that face loneliness and are isolated. This small act of kindness could bring great joy to someone who might otherwise be forgotten. Further information about this initiative will be provided via School Spider next week.

Finally, I would like to let you all know that after 6 years as a member of our Admin team, Natalie Dutton will be leaving us on Friday 15th November. I am sure that you will all want to join me in thanking her for her commitment to our community over her time at Broad Oak. Natalie consistently goes above and beyond her role to help and support our pupils and will be sorely missed. I wish her every future happiness in her new role working for Great Minds Together.

Acorns have been learning about Ancient Egyptians. They have made their own Snake Headdresses.








