
Could you provide a loving home for a rescue dog?




In the Nursery (Oak class) the children have been exploring how liquid (water) can turn into solid state (ice) and then melt into water again. The bonus of having snow last week was just a cherry on top towards our experiment. As the children had fun making some 'snow castles'. Scooping snow into cups with warm water and watching the snow melt straight away was magical!





LKS2 are working on a unit in Art called Painting and Mixed Media: Light and Dark.


This week the children have been using tints (adding white) and shades (adding black) to give a three-dimensional effect when painting.



They have used apples as their still life objects to draw and then paint. pieces.

They have looked at how some parts are lighter and others darker when deciding how to paint their artwork.

The children will then be looking at different painting techniques and about composition as they build up to their final Still Life outcome pieces.




In Reception we have been learning about Chinese New Year. We have been painting animals from the Chinese Zodiac.


